WEEK 1: UNITY IN PRAYER

Bringing differences and perspectives together

In the book of Acts, the early church prayed together on all occasions: in the temple, in their homes, when they were sick, when they were filled with the Spirit, at mealtimes, and in times of persecution.

As they devoted themselves to praying together, God used them to accomplish great things (increasing in numbers, building the foundation of the church, preaching, evangelizing, healing)

WEEK 2: PRAYER IS FORMATIONAL

Prayer forms who we are in God

As we pray:

1. God uses prayer to form who we are as a church and a community.
2. God humbles us and we live in His Truth by rejecting our own will (our desires, pride and achievements), but we choose to obey God
3. Our faith and understanding of God grows us He is molding and forming us to be more like Christ

"Humility is the principal aid to prayer"

When you seek for community whose foundation is in God, we begin to become less self-centered and remember most importantly that prayer is not only about us. It should be less of us, and more of Him. We are being pursued by God by being attentive and responsive to the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

School can often feel like a lonely place when we don't know anyone or enter an unfamiliar place. It can be hard to find people and friends to connect with.

Ask yourself. Have you been praying for your community that seeks to know more of Christ? But the bigger question is: have you been praying with your community to actively pursue the Truth and cultivates a life to be more like Christ Himself?

ACTION: Pray with your community and ask God to form you together to actively seek Christ's way.

Pray with your community and ask God to bring new students to join your fellowship and to form the community to be a welcoming environment that actively seeks to pursue and be molded more into Christ's way. Pray that students will be able to make intentional friendships and be connected to a strong Christian community.

Prayer helps us recognize our limitations. We are reminded our faith is not only between God and us. None of us should shoulder the burden of prayer alone for everyone and everything. During the school year, It is easy to focus on ourselves: our schoolwork, studies, future, relationships.

ACTION: Pray that God will increase our love and the capacity to care for others. Watch as God changes our heart when we begin to care and to serve for the good of others.

Reflect about this. When I am with others in prayer, do I genuinely want to know more about them or is it only about me? Did I serve my brothers and sisters in Christ out of love for them?

Remember it's not about you - when we pray and serve others, it is out of the love for God and for His glory.
